Buses Replace Weekend Trains

What's happening?

Beginning on Wednesday, October 3 and continuing through Thursday, October 11, the LIRR will be replacing Buckram Road Bridge in Locust Valley. The new bridge will increase vertical clearance above the roadway (from 10 feet to 14 feet), improving safety and greatly reducing the risk of vehicular strikes to the bridge. Accommodating this work will require road closures as well as changes to train service.

Road Closures/Traffic Impacts

- Buckram Road and Oyster Bay Road will be closed (except for local residential traffic) from **6:00 AM on Wednesday, October 3 through 6:00 AM on Thursday, October 11**. Vehicles will be detoured to Piping Rock Road and Duck Pond Road. There will be NO access underneath the bridge for the duration of the project.

Train Service Impacts

- Buses will replace trains on the Oyster Bay Branch from late evening on Friday, October 5 through Monday, October 8. A more limited busing program will be in effect between Locust Valley and Oyster Bay on Tuesday, October 9. Special timetables with additional details will be available as the project draws near.

Construction Timeline:

October 3-5 Crane Installation- Roadway Closure: normal daytime construction noise.

October 5-8 Bridge Removal/Track Raise/Bridge Installation - Roadway Closure: heavy daytime and nighttime construction noise; full Oyster Bay Branch train service outage.

October 9-11 Repaving- Roadway Closure: normal daytime construction noise; partial Oyster Bay Branch train service outage on October 9.

Note: Please expect intermittent partial road closures throughout October to complete residual work related to this bridge replacement project.

We regret any inconvenience our Oyster Bay neighbors experience while work is underway. We will make every effort to limit any disturbance to the surrounding community and complete this project in the shortest timeframe possible.
